Over the years, it has been used for many different hymns, and has been used as a secular dance tune, as well. There have been a number of English translations of the Christmas carol, the first of which appeared in print in 1692. A number of different English translations and interpretations have also been published over the years. The same melody is also used for the Easter hymn "Now the Green Blade Riseth".

This is a three-part arrangement, with melody, harmony, and backup parts. Remember to capo 1st fret. Find a couple of dulcimer-playing friends to join you and enjoy.
