HEAVENLY SUNLIGHT

"Heavenly Sunlight" was written Henry Jeffreys Zelley (1859-1942), an



ordained Methodist minister for over 50 years. In his spare time, he also wrote poetry, primarily of a religious nature. He is credited with having written the words to over 1500 hymns during his lifetime, of which about 100 were published in various hymnals. Among these include, "He Brought Me Out", "When Israel Out of Bondage

Came", "Mountains of Faith", and "He Rolled the Sea Away". But his most well-known work remains "Heavenly Sunlight". Part of its popularity is due in no small measure to the fact that it was featured as the theme song for a weekly radio program called "The Old Fashioned Revival Hour", hosted by the evangelist Charles E. Fuller from 1937 to 1968.

The music was written by George Cook, who at the time was a member of Zelley's congregation in Ocean Grove, New Jersey. He had composed a tune which he had in mind to use for a gospel hymn, but was having difficulty coming up with lyrics to match. He brought the tune to his pastor, and within a short time, Zelley had written a chorus and the first verse. Two weeks later, the choir at his church sang it in public for the first time.
